

I have before me your Christy calendar on which I have checked of rarions dates. but alas - no one of them has been the date of writing to ym! Ever since June of 1917 I have had France in my eye - but I would not come until a job ap-Reared which I could really do - and when Dr Lucas, the chief of the Childrens Bureau called for me in February of this year - to come to help in child wilfare Exhibitions. I came, For am I not trained as a teacher - and if ito to

teach mothers how to keep their children will - how proud Jan that I can do that - and 170000 people sow the first exhibition in a fort. night in Seyons. Then the Exhibition went to marseilles where I had charge of it. The I went, the first of July, to Eng. land + Scotland to study the methods in use there for safeguarding the health of the children.
